

READY TO ADOPT IT?

Seventeen checks a receiving force settles before a capability programme can be scoped. Instruction is no longer the scarce input — every item here is something a supplier cannot decide for you.

☐ **01 01 Capability • the outcome**

Written as something the force cannot currently do — not as a platform category.

☐ **02 01 Capability • an owner**

One officer owns the programme, and still owns it after the first cohort.

☐ **03 01 Capability • the trade**

Which task it replaces or reinforces, and which unit loses people to it.

☐ **04 02 Kit • the fleet**

The airframes and controllers you will actually field are decided, not pending.

☐ **05 02 Kit • command layer**

Whether the fleet has to talk to your existing systems, or stands alone.

☐ **06 02 Kit • consumption**

Airframes budgeted as consumables — training expends them like ammunition.

☐ **07 03 Cadre • named**

Individuals by surname, not a headcount in a staffing annex.

☐ **08 03 Cadre • protected time**

In writing, for the whole programme, with no second billet running alongside.

☐ **09 03 Cadre • succession**

A plan that says who trains the cadre's own replacements, and when.

☐ **10 04 Ground • classification**

The level of material you intend to receive is decided.

☐ **11 04 Ground • ROE and law**

The framework for what may be taught is settled on your side before scoping.

☐ **12 04 Ground • the split**

What runs as immersion in Ukraine, and what has to stay inside your own system.

☐ **13 05 Permissions • export control**

The transfer is controlled on the Ukrainian side; processing times are on the critical path.

☐ **14 05 Permissions • spectrum**

Training frequencies cleared with your national authority.

☐ **15 05 Permissions • airspace**

Arranged against the profile you intend to fly, not a range day.

☐ **16 06 Continuity • year two**

A budget line for spares, consumables and simulator maintenance.

☐ **17 06 Continuity • certification**

Certification of your own instructors is a dated contract milestone.

SEQUENCE Open the **cadre conversation first**: it is internal, slow, and every later decision assumes an answer. Start the **permission and spectrum clocks** in parallel — both can begin before a syllabus, a date or a final equipment list exists, and neither goes faster for being started late.

NOT SURE ABOUT EVEN ONE BLOCK?

Wiseboard works your current position against the seventeen checks, puts the permission and spectrum clocks in motion, and turns what is already decided into a defined scope — with a certified cadre of your own written into the end state.
